This piece is inspired by the young women who represent their schools, it's a celebration of each school in the Queensland Girls Secondary Schools Sports Association.

Each school is represented as circles in their school colours, the people who provide a safe space for these women in the school environment are those that surround each school in green and purple.

Every young woman has a story and a connection to the land they are on, by way of participating at school on the lands in which they play, train, and learn. I pay respect to the lands of First Nations people; this is represented in the art by the waterways with First Nations people sitting along the waterholes. People who attend sporting events to support these young women are represented in meeting places where sporting events take place.
