

Checklist for things you should have done already

1. Checked QCAA account to ensure your QCE point are correct and all external qualification are entered (e.g AMEB, Trinity, Dance)	
2. Registered for ATAR www.qtac.edu.au/atar	
3. Submitted QTAC application www.qtac.edu.au	
4. Checked QTAC application to see if there are any alerts outstanding	
 5. Updated any required documents such as: * EAS documents * Rural Access evidence (only if you live or have lived rurally) * Nursing applications need ANMAC declaration 	
6. If you need to send QTAC any documents but there isn't an <i>upload</i> button you can email to <i>documents@qtac.edu.au</i> . Include your name, LUI and QTAC application number	
7. If you have nominated for EAS but changed your mind about applying phone 1300 467 822 and have it removed	
8. Applied for a Tax File Number www.ato.gov.au	
9. Saved passwords somewhere other than on your school laptop	
10. Downloaded your important files to a USB (you will return your school laptop)	

Things you will need to do

Check your QTAC application and QCAA Learning Account regularly	
2. Respond to any offers (usually within four days)	
3. Look out for Enrolment information from the relevant institution	
4. Enrol in your course and set up a new university email – they will use this for correspondence going forward	
5. Study university information to select subjects (contact the university if you need help with this). This is where attendance at Orientation can be beneficial.	
6. Note the time and date to sign up for lectures and tutorials	
7. Familiarise yourself with university web pages e.g. QUT Blackboard, ACU Student Connect, etc.

ATAR and Senior Results

When and where do I find this?

Log on to your QTAC ATAR account on Friday 13 December. (Usually between 8am and 9am).

What do I do if I think my ATAR is incorrect?

QTAC offers an ATAR Appeals process which gives ATAR recipients the opportunity to request a review of their final ATAR result calculation. You can lodge an appeal with QTAC - https://www.qtac.edu.au/atar-appeals/.

Where do I find the results for my External Exams?

You can find the results for your External Exams on the QCAA Student Portal https://myqce.qcaa.qld.edu.au/. You will receive an overall mark out of 100 and a grade of A-E.

Where can I access my Queensland Certificate of Education?

Your Senior Education Profile (SEP) can also be accessed on the QCAA Student Portal. The documents in your learning account **are official** – they have a digital signature and unique document ID to confirm they are authentic. You can download and save the documents as a PDF from your learning account at any time. You will not be provided with a hard copy of your Queensland Certificate of Education – this must be accessed through the Student Portal.

If you're having trouble accessing the Student Portal, check the *FAQs* (*https://myqce.qcaa.qld.edu.au/assessment-and-results/results*) – they may have the answer you need.



How to change QTAC preferences

Refer to QTAC book page 19 https://www.qtac.edu.au/preferences/

You can change your preferences three times for free. There is a \$65 fee each time after this.

To change your preferences:

- Note: Do not save your preferences until you are sure they are exactly how you want them. Ensure this is done by noon (12pm) 18 December
- Log in to your QTAC account and select 'My Application'
- Under Course Preferences, select 'view or edit preferences', then 'change preferences'
- You can add, delete or edit your preferences, or re-order them using the drag and drop
- · Once you have made all of the changes you want, select continue
- Once you have made all of the changes you want, select continue

RESPONSE OPTIONS

Understanding how to respond to an offer is an essential step to securing your offer. Here is a summary of your options below:



ACCEPT

I'm happy and ready to enrol Check with the institution for enrolment details and dates



REJECT

I no longer wish to study

By rejecting your offer outright, you notify QTAC that you no longer wish to study or be considered for any other preferences



DEFER

I'm happy and not ready to enrol yet Rules for course deferral vary by

institution. Visit qtac.edu.au/deferment for institution policies



CONDITIONAL RESPONSE

I'd like to be considered for my higher preferences


You cannot use conditionally respond to your first preference

RESPONDING TO OFFERS

Respond to your offer by the date and time specified on your offer letter so that it does not expire.

To respond to your offer:

- · Log in to Application Services.
- Select the offer response again, and confirm your choice.


